#### FROM OUR ASSOCIATE PRIEST

Dear Friends,

"Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God". The opening words of Sunday's epistle from the First Letter of John, were a recurring part of my worshipping life when we lived in Scotland, because they introduce the greeting of peace in the Scottish Liturgy. They echo Jesus' new commandment given after he washed the disciples' feet at the Last Supper: "Love one another as I have loved you."

These words are not just an exhortation to try harder and do better, although it is clear that John is writing for a Christian community which has been divided over issues of doctrine; which has found that loving one another can be no easy matter. This is a recurring problem in Church life down the ages. The issue which seems to have divided John's church community was over knowledge of God. There were those who thought of this in terms of ideas rather than action. It is important to understand God properly, but the God who is revealed to us supremely in Jesus Christ is not an abstract idea but one who acts in love. Knowledge of God, therefore, can only be achieved by acting and living in love. John tells us very firmly that we cannot claim to love the God we have not seen if we do not love the brothers and sisters we can see. Nor are those brothers and sisters just people like us. It is easy to love humanity in general but loving particular human beings, the difficult and demanding, the awkward and prickly, the unlikable, can be much more challenging.

That is why it is important that we listen to John's recurring theme of the divine initiative: "In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us....We love because he first loved us". The proof of this is found in Jesus Christ and through the Holy Spirit we are enabled to abide, to dwell, to live in that perfect love which casts out fear.

One of the forms which fear takes is of difference. In the reading from Acts we see God taking the initiative to overcome difference, to break down barriers. The Ethiopian eunuch was someone who both race and physical state barred from the Temple. In spite of these barriers he had been drawn to the God of the Jews. The Spirit instructs Philip to approach him and help him understand the scripture he is reading as being fulfilled in Jesus. The encounter leads to his request for baptism and his incorporation in the people of God.

In the Gospel Jesus speaks to the disciples at the Last Supper of the deep relationship, the mutual abiding, between himself and believers. He is the vine and they are the branches. Love which is true does not leave us unchanged. If we refuse that change love will not grow and may well die. Jesus speaks of the Father as the vine-grower who prunes the branches of the vine so that they may bear more fruit. He also clears away the dead wood. When the branch is ourselves, the experience of being pruned can be a painful one, and its benefits may not be recognisable for some time. A pruned vineyard looks pretty barren before new

growth bears fruit. Self-examination, both individual and communal, is a demanding exercise. It is then that we need to remember that priority of God's love and not despair of it but trust in the God whose "nature is always to have mercy", and who makes possible our abiding in the love of Christ.

For me, one of the best reminders of this is in George Herbert's poem;

Love bade me welcome. Yet my soul drew back Guilty of dust and sin.

But quick-eyed Love, observing me grow slack From my first entrance in,

Drew nearer to me, sweetly questioning, If I lacked any thing.

A guest, I answered, worthy to be here:
Love said, You shall be he.
I the unkind, ungrateful? Ah my dear,
I cannot look on thee.
Love took my hand, and smiling did reply,
Who made the eyes but I?

Truth Lord, but I have marred them: let my shame Go where it doth deserve.

And know you not, says Love, who bore the blame? My dear, then I will serve.

You must sit down, says Love, and taste my meat: So I did sit and eat.

#### **FIRST READING**

ACTS 8:26-END

An angel of the Lord said to Philip, 'Get up and go towards the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza.' (This is a wilderness road.) So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. Then the Spirit said to Philip, 'Go over to this chariot and join it.' So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, 'Do you understand what you are reading?' He replied, 'How can I, unless someone guides me?' And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this:

'Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, so he does not open his mouth.

In his humiliation justice was denied him.

Who can describe his generation?

For his life is taken away from the earth.'

The eunuch asked Philip, 'About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?' Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, 'Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?' He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

#### **SECOND READING**

1 JOHN 4:7-END

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us.

By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. And we have seen and do testify that the Father has sent his Son as the Saviour of the world. God abides in those who confess that Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God. So we have known and believe the love that God has for us.

God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness on the day of judgement, because as he is, so are we in this world. There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. We love because he first loved us. Those who say, 'I love God', and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also.

#### **GOSPEL READING**

JOHN 15:1-8

Jesus said to his disciples, 'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine-grower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples.'

#### **POST COMMUNION**

Eternal God, whose Son Jesus Christ is the way, the truth, and the life: grant us to walk in his way, to rejoice in his truth, and to share his risen life; who is alive and reigns, now and for ever. **Amen**

And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also. And you know the way to the place where I am going.' Thomas said to him, 'Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?' Jesus said to him, 'I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. If you know me, you will know my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him.' Philip said to him, 'Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied.' Jesus said to him, 'Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, "Show us the Father"? Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own; but the Father who dwells in me does his works. Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; but if you do not, then believe me because of the works themselves. Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it.'
